Please apply as a transfer student and indicate your major as pre-nursing (0989) on forms for admission to the university. The Gateway Coordinator will change your major to RN-BSN once you are in the program.

Each RN applies by meeting with the Gateway Coordinator after receiving acceptance to UTC as an undergraduate transfer student, and having submitted transcripts for evaluation. Admission to the university, graduation from an accredited diploma or associate degree nursing program, a current RN license, and a minimum GPA of 2.0 meets the requirements for admission to the RN-BSN concentration.

Any BSN Gateway student who has not practiced in an acute care setting within the past five years will be required to take Nursing 4540: Nursing Practicum VI.

The university requires 60 hours at a 4 year university/college and that at least 25% of the required hours for the degree be taken at UTC. A current RN license shows that RN students have passed NCLEX and is used to give credit for 7 hours of Nursing Fundamentals at the 2000 level and 27 hours of Adult, Maternal/Child, and Psychiatric Nursing at the 3000-4000 level. The hours will be entered in the student's academic record as S (satisfactory) the semester of graduation and count toward the requirement of 60 hours at a 4 year school. You may take classes outside UTC only if you do not violate these policies: the 60 hour rule, at least 39 hours at 3000-4000 level, and at least 25% of credit hours taken under direction of UTC faculty.
