

Additional Advising Information

Times for advising

- Advisement for students in major groups will be at 10 a.m. with the presentation. Faculty from various disciplines will join these major groups at 11 a.m. Actual registration begins at 1 p.m. in designated labs around campus. See the appropriate sheets for your correct location.

Command Center (located in smaller computer lab in the University Center)

- Representatives from Admissions, IT, Records, and the Provost's Office will be available
- Opens at noon and will stay open until all students are registered

Check out after registration

Lab science courses

- If students sign up for Biology 121 or Environmental Science 150, they **MUST** sign up for a lab because the lab grade is included in the final grade for the course.

- Chemistry is only going to have about 50 123 lab spaces available for the June 26 orientation. It is OK for students who need ONLY 121/123 to take 121 now and 123 later. Students who need to go on to 122 need to take both now. Students who really NEED a lab and cannot get in one can be sent to Gretchen Potts in EMCS 206 for a closed class form (look for her signature, not Gail Meyer's). Gretchen will not be signing closed class forms just so people can have a different time when there are still openings at night. **REVISED 6.24.09**

Step Ahead Math

- All students who are eligible to take Step Ahead Math should be registered for Math 106. Should they pass, they will be placed into a college level course in August.

AP Scores and Dual Enrollment

- All scores already received at UTC have been entered into the system. However, if we have not received the scores, then students may register for the next level course contingent on UTC's receiving notice that the students have passed the exam. It is the student's responsibility to be enrolled in the appropriate course.

Supplemental Instruction
