POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT: Assistant Professor of Graphic Design

The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga invites applicants for a tenure-track appointment as Assistant Professor in Art in a NASAD accredited program beginning August 1, 2012. MFA required. Candidates should evidence sound knowledge of current and emerging technologies and production processes, and a demonstrated interest in both traditional and experimental approaches to contemporary design theory and practice. Candidate will be expected to engage in advising and service to the institution and will assume an active role in ongoing curricular development in Graphic Design. Candidate must have teaching experience at the Graduate Assistant-level or beyond. Preference will be given to candidates who demonstrate a record of creative achievement and teaching effectiveness. Applications must include the following content submitted as three (3) separate .pdf files: 1) Cover Letter, CV, Teaching Philosophy, and Artist's Statement; 2) 20 samples of personal work, appropriately labeled; and 3) 20 samples of student work, appropriately labeled.
