**Position Announcement: Assistant/Associate Professor  
Management Information Systems/Business Analytics**

The Department of Management at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga invites applications for a full time, tenure track faculty position in Management Information Systems with a specialty in Business Intelligence/Data Analytics at the Assistant or Associate Professor level beginning in August 2012. The College of Business at UTC has a long-standing AACSB accreditation, a reputation of quality at both the undergraduate and MBA levels, and Business Week has five times named the UTC undergraduate business program among the top 100 in the nation.

Requirements: Ph.D. in Management Information Systems or a closely related area from an accredited college or university, a strong research portfolio, and demonstrated teaching ability in undergraduate and graduate level courses. A specialty in Databases/Business Intelligence/Data Analytics is required.

Faculty are expected to teach and research in the following areas: database management systems, advanced query languages, and business intelligence. Familiarity with database management systems and tools such as Access, Oracle, SPSS, SAS, and other Programming and Data Mining Languages is preferred. Responsibilities include teaching nine credit hours per semester, research leading to refereed journal publications, and university and community service.

Review of applications will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled. Members of underrepresented groups are strongly encouraged to apply. UTC is an equal opportunity/affirmative action/Title VI and Title IX/Section 504/ADA /ADEA institution.

The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga is a metropolitan university of 11,500 students offering baccalaureate degrees in 44 fields, masters in 22, and doctorates in three. Founded as a private university in 1886, it became a primary campus of the University of Tennessee in 1969. Its 100-acre campus is located near downtown Chattanooga, in the center of a very scenic metropolitan area of more than 450,000. Chattanooga has been featured in US News and World Report and Parade as one of America's most livable cities. The city has gained international attention for its downtown and riverfront development, public and private partnerships, and excellent quality of life. Recently, a Volkswagen plant was established in Chattanooga.
