**Position Announcement: Assistant Professor of Statistics**

The Department of Mathematics at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga (UTC) invites applications for a tenure track Assistant Professor of Statistics beginning August 1, 2012, which is subject to final budget approval. A Ph.D. is required as are teaching, research, advising, and service activities commensurate with a full time faculty position. The successful candidates must have a record of excellence in teaching at the college level and an ongoing established research program. The salary is competitive; the teaching load is 3 courses per semester with a reduced load during the first year. There are a number of internal sources of research funds that can also lead to a reduced teaching load in subsequent years. Preference will be given to candidates in Actuarial Mathematics, Bioinformatics, or Applied Statistics. The specific area of research is not as important as the ability to make substantial contributions to the Actuarial Science concentration in our B.S. program and the Applied Statistics concentration in the M.S. program.

Applications from women and minorities are especially encouraged. Screening of all applicants will begin January 15, 2012, and will continue until all positions are filled. In addition to submitting an AMS Standard Cover Sheet, a curriculum vitae, an unofficial transcript, and other supporting documents, applicants should arrange for three letters of recommendation to be addressed to Professor Ronald Smith, Chair of the Hiring Committee. UTC is a metropolitan institution, one of four primary campuses of the University of Tennessee, and has an enrollment of 9900 undergraduate and 1500 graduate students.
