Position Announcement: Assistant Professor

The Department of Psychology at The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga (UTC) invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position in Biological and / or Lifespan Development Psychology/Psychology of Aging at the assistant professor level. The primary teaching responsibility for this position will include some combination of the following: physiological psychology, sensation and perception, adolescence, adulthood and aging, applied developmental, lifespan development, and research methods, along with graduate and undergraduate courses in specialty area. The ability to teach qualitative research methods is desired. The typical teaching load in the department is three courses per semester; faculty are expected to balance and actively engage in teaching, research, and service. UTC faculty should also demonstrate a commitment to diversity by a willingness to engage in interdisciplinary research, work with diverse students and colleagues, and use a variety of teaching methods or curricular perspectives.

Ideal candidates will provide evidence of strong teaching skills and an active research program with the ability to collaborate with masters and undergraduate students. Research interests should be applied and with human subjects; laboratory facilities for animal or basic neuropsychological and physiological research are limited. Preference will be given to candidates who complement the research interests of current program faculty. The Department of Psychology at UTC has 13 full-time faculty members with over 550 undergraduate majors and master's programs in Research and I-O Psychology. Current faculty research interests include Health and Sport Psychology, Developmental Psychology, Psychology and Law, Psychology and Religion, Personality/Individual Differences, Stress and Wellbeing, and Industrial-Organizational psychology. Department faculty collaborate on a wide variety of applied research projects with local physicians, teaching and rehabilitation hospitals, other departments on campus, and a variety of private and non-profit organizations in the community.

Chattanooga is a city of over 150,000 residents with a wide variety of outdoor, cultural, and community events that make it an excellent place to live, work, and raise a family. Chattanooga was recently named the #1 city for outdoor living by Outdoor Magazine and it is well-known for its natural beauty, high quality of life, and low cost of living. The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga is a metropolitan university with that serves 11,000 regional, national, and international students. It is well-regarded as a top public regional institution of higher learning.
