Position Announcement: Assistant Professor
Physical Chemistry**

The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga invites applications for a tenure-track appointment as Assistant Professor in Chemistry beginning August 1, 2012. The Ph.D. in physical chemistry is required. Teaching, postdoctoral experience, and an emphasis in computational chemistry are strongly preferred. Teaching responsibilities will include physical chemistry, a contribution to the general chemistry sequence, and courses in the area of expertise. The successful applicant will be expected to establish a productive undergraduate research program. The chemistry program at UTC (Chattanooga, Tennessee) is staffed by an eleven-member faculty and is approved by the American Chemical Society. The department has over 300 majors and is noted for excellence in undergraduate education and research (see <http://www.utc.edu/Chemistry/>). Applicants must submit a resume, a one page statement of teaching philosophy, a one or two page description of research interests, and arrange for three letters of recommendation to be sent. All application materials, including letters of recommendation must contain the reference Assistant Professor Physical Chemistry and must be sent to facultyvitae04@utc.edu. Screening of applicants will begin immediately, and will continue until the position is filled.
