UTeaChattanooga Program
Position Announcement

The College of Arts and Sciences seeks to appoint a Master Teacher in science to the UTeaChattanooga program, an exciting program for preparing secondary mathematics and natural science teachers. The successful candidate must hold a master's degree or doctorate and will preferably have at least ten years experience as a secondary natural science teacher. The appointment will begin July 1, 2012.

The UTeaChattanooga program, currently in its second year of operation, is designed to permit students to earn a degree in mathematics or the natural sciences in a four-year period and also the credentials necessary to obtain teacher certification. A key component of the program is the role of the Master Teachers, who mentor students, teach field-based pedagogy courses, and work with local public school teachers who supervise UTeaChattanooga students teaching in their classrooms. The Master Teachers play an essential role in recruiting students for the program and providing support for graduates of the program as they begin their teaching careers.

The Master Teacher will hold the rank of Clinical Instructor or Clinical Assistant Professor, depending upon credentials. The position has a 9-month instructional appointment with a one-month summer administrative appointment. Master Teachers are not eligible for tenure. Reappointment will depend upon satisfactory performance and university resources.
