



Jocelyn Sanders earned a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Wisconsin, a Master of Music degree from Northwestern University, and a Bachelor of Music and the Performer's Certificate from the Eastman School of Music. She completed advanced horn performance studies at Indiana University and the Yale Summer School of Music and Art.

Before her appointment as Associate Provost, Dr. Sanders served as Acting Associate Provost for Academic Affairs for five years. Previously, she served as head of the Department of Music for eight years and has been a member of the music faculty since 1980. She has been a member of the Board of Directors of the Chattanooga Musicians Union, the Board of Advisors of the Southeast Horn Workshop, and various committees of the Tennessee Higher Education Commission, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, the Chattanooga Symphony and Opera Association, and Allied Arts of Greater Chattanooga, and other community organizations.

Dr. Sanders was Principal Horn of the Chattanooga Symphony for 16 years, and was a featured soloist with the orchestra in 1984 and 1992. She is a founding member of the Chattanooga Brass Quintet and has worked as a free-lance musician in the Chattanooga area, Nashville, and Chicago. Dr. Sanders is known regionally as a performer on the natural horn and as a recitalist. Her research interests include alternative pedagogical techniques and early music for the horn - in particular, works by Mozart and Beethoven. Dr. Sanders also serves as Music Director of the Northside Presbyterian Church in North Chattanooga.
