

# Learning Disability Documentation Guidelines

Students who are requesting support services from the Office for Students with Disabilities at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga are required to submit documentation to verify eligibility under the ADA of 1990. Eligibility for civil rights protection requires the applicant to meet one of the following three prongs of the civil rights definition of disability:

- 1) have a physical or mental condition that substantially limits one or more major life activity;
- 2) have a record of such a physical or mental condition; and
- 3) be regarded as having such an impairment, whether actually having the impairment or not.

## Learning Disability

### Documentation Within the

#### past three (3) years:

1. A psychological evaluation by a Psychologist or Psychological Examiner that lists all subtests and standard scores.

The Intelligence Test must be a complete test (no Screenings) and should be one from the following list:

Kaufman Adolescent and Adult Intelligence Test Standard-Binet  
Intelligence Scale Fourth Edition Wechsler Adult Intelligence Scale  
(WAIS II) Woodcock-Johnson Psychoeducational Battery -  
Revised: Test of Cognitive Ability -i

2. A complete achievement battery (no screenings) should be one from the following list:

Scholastic Abilities Test for Adults (SATA)  
Stanford Test of Academic Skills  
Woodcock-Johnson Psychoeducational Battery - Revised: Tests of Achievement  
Wechsler Individual Achievement Test (WIAT)

**\*\*\*Achievement test MUST include broad/composite scores for reading, mathematics, and written language.**
