Associate/Bachelor’s Articulation Policies

This program articulation agreement between CSTCC and UTC will lead to the awarding of both the associate and bachelor’s degrees if the student successfully completes all the courses outlined in the agreement and satisfies all other academic regulation and graduation requirements. Transfer students to UTC will not be expected to satisfy any additional (or fewer) requirements than non-transfer (native) UTC students.

1. Students may choose to follow any articulation agreement in effect while they are enrolled at CSTCC, provided they graduate from CSTCC no later than five years and from UTC no later than 10 years after the Fall semester of the academic year indicated on the agreement. However, transfer students will be required to comply with any catalog changes affecting any academic policies or degree program changes that are required of non-transfer UTC students.
2. This articulation agreement assumes that all courses used to satisfy requirements listed in the Freshman and Sophomore years will be completed in residence at CSTCC with a minimum grade of “C”. Students who transfer credits to CSTCC from other schools may use the articulation agreements as advising guides; however, non-CSTCC credits must be independently evaluated by UTC to determine transferability.
3. Students who transfer to UTC from two-year institutions must complete at least 60 semester hours at a senior institution.
4. The final 24 semester hours must be completed in residence at UTC.
5. At least 39 hours of the 120 hours needed for graduation must be taken at the 300 level or above.
6. Transfer students to UTC must meet the admission and continuation standards as outlined in the University catalog at the time of transfer to UTC.
7. The awarding or use of any non-traditional credit (e.g., CLEP, AP, IEP, credit by exam, military services, etc.) must be approved by the degree-granting institution.
8. In addition to the specific course requirements for a bachelor’s degree, all transfer students must satisfy any specific program, major or degree requirement or academic regulation that might be required for entrance to or continuation in a specific program as well as all of the University’s requirements for graduation.
9. The agreement as outlined does not supersede the requirements approved by the faculty of UTC.
