Program Costs

Youth University (rising 1st-6th graders):

Students may register for one to four classes a day. Each class meets daily for one hour and twenty minutes. Students must register for an entire week/session. The fees for classes include all materials except where designated in class descriptions.

One week session

Junior Camps (rising 7th-10th graders):

Junior Camps take place as an all day (9 am– 4 pm) camp, an overnight camp, or as a half day camp. Each camp is a week long. Students must register for an entire week/session. Each camp is priced differently, so please refer to the registration form on page 8 for pricing. ***For all day adventure and sports camps, each student should bring his/her own lunch unless otherwise specified.***

Family Discounts: Families with two or more children attending all four classes of Youth University or all day at Junior Camp in the same session(s) will receive a 5% discount on each child's fees.

Closed or Cancelled Classes: UTC reserves the right to close any class that is filled or cancel any class that does not have sufficient enrollment. Should a class be closed or cancelled, students will automatically be placed in an alternate course. In the event that all other options are closed or cancelled, Continuing Education will notify the registrant as soon as possible.

****Payment secures the child a spot in class. NO REFUNDS will be issued after a session has started. All refund requests must be made in writing at least five days prior to the beginning of the session (cancellation fees apply).**



Important Information

Childcare Procedures

Morning and afternoon childcare will be available for an added convenience. Morning (AM) childcare is scheduled from 7:30-9:00 am and afternoon (PM) childcare from 4:00-5:30 pm. There is no childcare provided during regularly scheduled classes (9:00 am– 4:00 pm), and we do not provide adult supervision before 7:30 am or after 5:30 pm.

Cost per week

Morning childcare \$15

Afternoon childcare \$15

No discounts are offered on childcare. These are flat rates and do not vary upon arrival or departure time. Childcare will be held at the same location as the camp. Children may be dropped off no earlier than 7:30 am and must be picked up no later than 5:30 pm. When picking up a child, a parent, guardian, or other authorized individual must come inside the building and sign the child out.

If a child is not signed out by 5:30 pm, an additional charge of \$5 for any time up to 30 minutes and \$2 per minute thereafter will be charged. Any child left after 4:15 pm not enrolled in afternoon care will be sent to the afternoon care room and be charged \$5 for the day.

This policy will be enforced.

Personal Equipment

Some classes require special equipment; therefore, please properly mark all of the articles sent from home so that there will be no mistake to whom it belongs. Swimming classes require that your child bring a bathing suit, towel, and some type of bag for wet articles. All athletic classes (tennis, soccer, flag it, basketball, ultimate games, etc...) require tennis shoes to be worn.

Emergency Information

Before your child will be able to participate in Youth University or Junior Camps, we must have a completed Emergency Contact/Medical Release Form. Please fill this form out (found on page 5) and bring it or fax it anytime before the start of your child's first session. Should any of the information change, please contact us immediately. If you need to reach a Youth University staff member for any reason, please call 423-425-4344.

Discipline

Even though this is not a regular school setting, we do have rules that must be followed. If your child is causing a problem within a classroom, the teacher has permission to send the child to the YU office and ask that the parent be called. If the child has to be sent to the office three times, your child will be asked not to return and a refund for the remainder of the week will be issued.

YU Instructors & Staff

Youth University instructors and staff are local school teachers, UTC faculty, personnel, and students, local artists, and individuals in the community expressing an interest in educating our youth. Our enthusiastic YU staff is looking forward to another great summer of new and exciting classes.

Lunch

YU students have two options for lunch:

1. Students may bring their own lunch every day. Drink and snack machines are available if you wish to send money with your child.
 2. Students may sign up to get lunch provided for the week by UTC Food Service. The cost is \$25 per week. The menu includes one of the following each day- pizza, chicken tenders, hot dogs, hamburgers, and cold cut sandwiches-with fruit, dessert, and a drink.
- NO SUBSTITUTIONS ARE ALLOWED. Sign up for lunch can only be done as an entire week, not on a daily basis. This can be done either at the time of registration or by Wednesday of the week before.

Due to the nature of many of the Junior Camps, buying lunch is not always an option and lunch should be brought each day unless otherwise specified. Please refer to the registration form on page 8.

Parking

Youth University and Junior Camps will meet in Hunter Hall on McCallie at Baldwin on the UTC campus. Parking is available in University Lot 21, located on Baldwin Street. In order to park in that lot, you must use the parking permit provided here. The permit must be visible at all

times when dropping off or picking up your child. You will be responsible for any tickets received.

Drop Off & Pick Up

On the first day of each session, parents should bring their child in and check-in with a member of the YU staff. Children will then be directed to the proper room. All other days the child may be dropped off at the door where a YU staff member will be waiting. At the end of the day, all children going home at 4:00 pm will be led out to the carpool line. *To join the carpool line, take Oak Street (off Palmetto) towards Baldwin. Come through the gates and watch for YU staff.* All children must be signed out at the carpool line. If your child is getting picked up by someone other than you, please fill out a Pick Up Authorization Form and send it with your child to inform the YU staff. Any child not picked up by 4:15 pm will be sent to afternoon care and the parent will be charged for that service. All children enrolled in afternoon care will be taken to a different room. When picking a child up from afternoon care, please park and come into the building and sign your child out. **YOUR CHILD MUST BE SIGNED OUT ANYTIME HE OR SHE IS PICKED UP- EVEN IN THE MIDDLE OF THE DAY!**

Junior Camp Descriptions

Artistic Media Exploration

July 17-21, 9 am– 4 pm (grades 7-10)

Art is more than just paintbrushes and pastels. In fact, there are thousands of media with which to create a work of art. This week will explore some of those. Come and learn how to expand your artistic horizons with clay, paper mache, batik, and more. You will be doing multiple art projects each day, so you are sure to find your niche. This is a good opportunity for established artists to master new techniques or for a beginning artist to be introduced to many different areas. (\$200)

Backpacking Excursion

July 17-21, all overnight (grades 7-10)

Do you like to hike? How does 25 miles of hiking through the Virginia Highlands sound? If you've never done anything like this before, this trip will be a chance for you to learn what backpacking is all about. You will begin your journey at Grayson Highlands State Park and will continue to hike and camp through the mountains and meadows of Virginia, ending your week with a rafting trip on the New River on Friday. Experienced or first time backpackers are welcome. If you need equipment, we will provide that for you. It's all taken care of so all you have to do is show up and be ready for fun! (\$375)

June 26-30, 9 am– 4 pm* (grades 7-9)

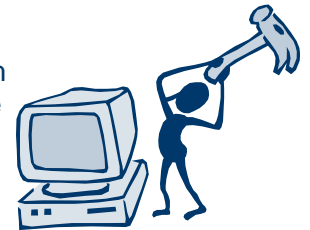
July 31-Aug. 4, 9 am– 4 pm* (grades 7-10)

June 19-23, 1 pm– 4 pm (grades 7-10)

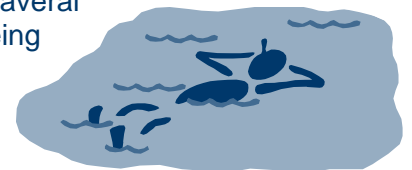
