A Fun Recipe for Kids

Pail of Sand Cake

RECIPE INGREDIENTS

- 1 Baked 8-inch round cake
- 1 8-to-9-cup capacity new plastic sand pail
- 24 oz. unsweetened applesauce (or one 3oz. package pudding, prepared)
- 1 Cup crushed graham crackers or cookies
- Shell candies
- 1 Plastic shovel



DIRECTIONS:



1. Cut the cake into 1-inch slices.
2. Fit the slices into the pail, alternating layers of cake with applesauce or pudding, ending with applesauce.
3. Sprinkle on the crushed cookie "sand"
4. Dig in the plastic shovel
5. Add shell candies for decoration

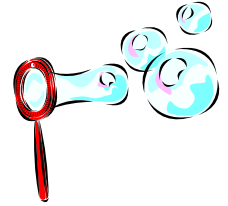
Craft Corner



Homemade Bubbles

CRAFT MATERIALS:

- 1/2 cup Dishwashing detergent (120 ml)
- 4 1/2 Cup Water (1.1 liter)
- 4 Tablespoons glycerin (available at pharmacies)
- Container with a tight fitting lid in which to keep the bubbles



DIRECTIONS:

- Gather all your supplies
- Measure out the water, detergent, and glycerin into container
- GENTLY stir the mixture together. (If a foam forms, gently skim it off of the top)
- Find something with which to blow bubbles and begin to have fun. (Wire coat hangers bent in a circle work well for large bubbles).

Note: The longer you let the mixture set, the larger the bubbles are and the longer they seem to last.

WHAT YOU NEED:

- Sprinkler
- Get-wet props

HOW TO PLAY:

Set up a course. Stations could include drop-kicking a water balloon, jumping rope in the sprinkler spray, shooting a squirt gun at a predetermined target, or any other creatively wet challenges. Use a stopwatch to keep time or run a relay.
