Course description: Calculator and computer treatment of problems and topics in Math 151 using graphical, numerical, and symbolic methods.

Pre-or-corequisite: Math 151.

Assignments and Grades: There will be a Mid-term exam and a Final exam each counting a fourth toward the final grade. The remaining half of the final grade will come from completing computer projects. **Every student must hand in their own assignment.** Copying parts from another student's assignment is strictly prohibited. Failing to do so will result in a grade of 0 for such an assignment. Computer projects must be handed in on the due date at the beginning of class. 10 points per late hour, with the clock starts running at the beginning of class, will penalize late assignments. The mid-term exam cannot be made up unless you have extraordinary circumstances and have discussed your situation with me. No extra-credit assignments will be given.
