Each term, I teach two units of the 100-level General Education course *World Civilizations I* which covers world history from the dawn of man until AD 1000. In addition to these, I also teach an upper division course on the ancient world per term; I have offered thus far *Roman History to Caesar* and *Roman Imperial History*. This year I will be teaching *Classical Women* in the Fall in addition to coordinating independent study projects on the Roman Empire and Greek political and constitutional thought, a Greek topic to be determined in the Spring, and *Roman Britain* in the summer via the UTC Oxford program. Duties also include individual student advisement and administrative tasks on an *ad hoc* basis.
