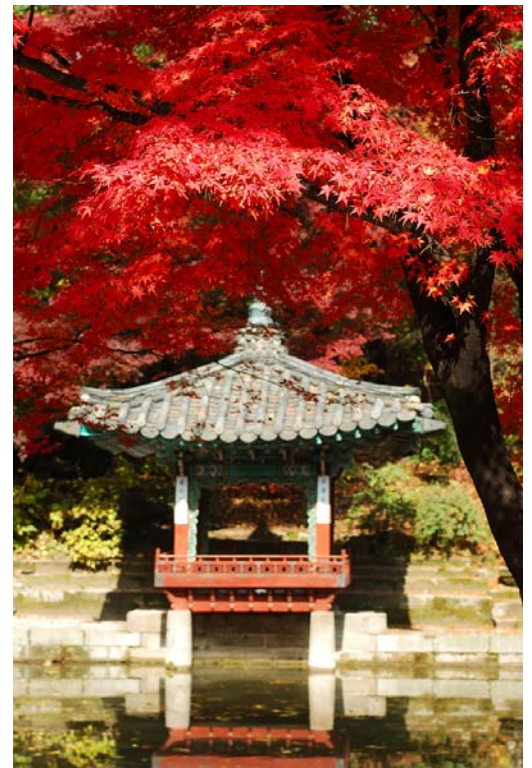
Include East Asia in Your Courses

Tennessee and North Georgia educators in elementary, middle, and high schools who would like to learn more about East Asia and include Asia content in their curricula are eligible to apply.

Receive Stipends and Curricular Materials

Tennessee and North Georgia teachers and librarians in elementary, middle, and high schools who would like to learn more about East Asia and include Asia content in their curricula are eligible to apply.

Participants attend both the spring and fall workshops nearest their home and complete five brief online assignments.

You also obtain verification from your principal or supervisor that, if returning to your current school in the fall of 2009, you will teach at least one section of Social Studies, World History, Geography, Literature, Languages, Music, or Art. If you are an elementary teacher or media specialist, your supervisor should verify that some of your instructional time may be spent on Asia.
