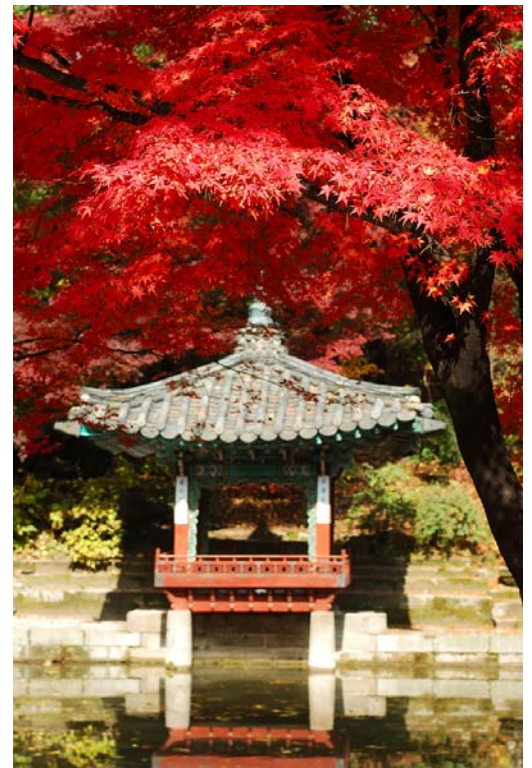
Include East Asia in Your Courses

Increase your knowledge of the histories and cultures of these countries. The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga and Belmont University in Nashville will conduct a professional development program on East Asia between late April and early September 2010.

Funded by the Freeman Foundation, the National Consortium for Teaching about Asia (NCTA), and the East Asian Curriculum

Project of Columbia University will make NCTA available to teachers in our region for the 12th consecutive year.

Forty teachers will be selected for this professional development opportunity and upon completion of the program, each teacher will receive a \$500.00 stipend, as well as curriculum materials on China, Japan, and Korea.

supervisor should
verify that some of
your instructional
time may be spent
on Asia.
