



Decrease in pogram length

A significant decrease in program length and/or credit hours is a substantive change requiring review and approval by the Board of Trustees. The institution should provide the following information to the Commission:

- a description of the program,

- a description of the program,
 the rationale for the decrease,
 a 'before' and 'after' comparison of the curricula,
 the change in student learning outcomes,
 an analysis of the impact of the change in student learning outcomes,
 an explanation of how program quality and integrity are maintained with fewer credit hours and/or a shorter time-to-completion, and
 an explanation of the impact on staffing and faculty workloads.

Increase in p ogram length

A significant increase in program length and/or credit hours is a substantive change requiring review and approval by the Board of Trustees. The institution should provide the following information to the Commission:

- a description of the program,
 the rationale for the increase,

- the rationale for the increase,
 a "before" and "after" comparison of the curricula,
 the change in student learning outcomes,
 an analysis of the impact of the change in student learning outcomes,
 an explanation of the impact on students' time-to-completion,
 an explanation of the financial impact to students, and
 an explanation of the impact on staffing and faculty workloads.

Degree completion programs



- Working definition: requires prior completion of collegelevel credit as a condition of admission
- May be time-compressed delivery (non-traditional terms)
- May have non-degree completion analog



Policy interpretation: all
degree completion programs
require approval prior to
implementation

- Note policy criteria assume time-compressed delivery – that may or may not be the case for your program
- So



Prospectus content – see items #3 and #4 in policy (p. 28-29) and keep this in mind –

 What you are demonstrating is the degree completion delivery will not compromise the quality and integrity of the credential



 If applicable, the degree completion delivery does not materially differ from the non-degree completion delivery of the program in quality and qualifications of the teaching faculty.



- Describe the five program characteristics in policy (Appendix B) if they don't apply to your program
- Exception to Appendix B: you can address only items #3 and #4 referenced above in a narrative form prospectus



Program Changes that are
Not Substantive

- Program and course name changes
- Alignment to state naming requirements
- Offering existing programs at already-approved off-campus instructional sites
- Relatively small changes in program length



 CIP code changes, but determine if significant enough to be a new, different program Administrative realignment of programs, e.g., moved into different departments or colleges within the institution 	
Delivering an existing program by distance delivery (e.g., online) if the institution has been approved for distance delivery
