I am a Humanities: International Studies major because UTC does not offer a major in Art History. My focus of interest lies in this field; it is my passion. My dream is to work in a museum as a curator, own/work in a gallery or an auction house, or work as a preservationist, consultant, or collections manager. I would also enjoy teaching Art History, but it is not my first choice. I have chosen all of my upper-level courses around topics in art history in order to prepare me for these careers.

Useful courses would include Major Trends in American Art (ART 414), Design History (ART 499), and the History of Modern Painting and Sculpture (ART 315).
