2017 Impact Analysis








The following report illustrates the economic contributions made by the Chattanooga Zoo to the Southeastern Tennessee region in 2017. Economic contributions are created through operational spending, capital projects, employment wages, and volunteerism. Annual expenditures for wages, salaries, as well as goods and services reflect the Chattanooga Zoo's direct impact on the local economy. These in turn, have residual effects termed induced and indirect impact. Indirect effects represent how initial expenditures prompt increased spending from interrelated businesses within the supply chain. Induced effects signify the economic influences made on all local industries caused by new household income created from the Zoo's direct impact. To clarify, this study was based solely on expenditures provided by the zoo's operations ledger and does not include a tourism effect. Examining a tourism aspect would involve an analysis of visitor data and assessing where else in the economy travelers were spending their money (i.e., hotels, restaurants, retail stores, etc.). Thus, the economic contributions illustrated in the report represent conservative figures in relationship to other economic contribution studies which included visitor data in their final economic multiplier.



Methods

Operations

The study employed an economic contribution analysis, which differs from an impact analysis in that it analyzes existing organizational ventures rather than new economic activity. Data was analyzed by using an input-output model, Impact Analysis for PLANing (IMPLAN), to estimate the Zoo's economic contributions. Expenditure data was gathered through correspondence with representatives from the Chattanooga Zoo. Itemized operational and capital expenses were each coded to reflect specific economic sectors within the IMPLAN software. Overall, these expenses fell among 27 unique categories. The next step involved identifying a regional geographic impact area that would best represent a regional impact. Eighteen counties were included to reflect a Southeastern Tennessee impact region. This delineation then permitted the research team to identify what percentage of each commodity purchased was done within the designated region. Only expenses which were made with vendors residing within the impact region were included in the analysis.

Employee Wages

Induced impacts from increased household income from employee expenditures on the local economy were also taken into consideration when generating the economic impact from annual operations to the Southeastern Tennessee region.

Volunteerism

Economic impacts pertaining to volunteerism was established according to standards set by The Independent Sector. This is a non-partisan network of organizations providing, among other services, research expertise to nonprofits. According to their assessments, volunteer work in Chattanooga, TN is valued at \$21.98 per hour.

Total Economic Impact is the result of a non-linear ripple effect generated from the direct expenditures made by the Zoo within the specified Southeastern TN region. In the table above, the *Direct Effect* represents the marginal (non-leaked) money remaining in the region. *Indirect* Effects are the result of local businesses spending more on employment and materials, as a result of added business. *Induced Effects* include additional spending by local employees as a result of increased hours/income due to zoo operations. Further, these effects impact the region in various ways: 1) *Employmen*t: the number of full-year, fulltime jobs supported by the zoo, 2) *Labor Income*: added income for current employees, 3) Total Value: true profits after accounting for employment, taxes, and other everyday business expenses, and 4) Output: total overall sales and revenue from zoo operations.
