Teacher Preparation Program Presentation & Discussion

Question from the members with answer provided by Chelsey Wiseman, UTC student in the School of Education:

Q: What is your day like in the classroom?

A: Ms. Wiseman indicated her day began by arriving early to the school before the students. She is teaching all subjects which she initially found intimidating. After conversations with her mentor teacher regarding subject expertise, they decided to develop a team teaching model which leveraged each of their strengths.

Questions from the members with answers provided by Dr. Valerie Rutledge, Dean of the College of Health, Education and Professional Studies:

Q: Is UTC's goal to give one or multiple mentors to students?

A: Currently, the pilot connects students to one mentor teacher. In the future, the program will connect students to multiple mentors both during their time at UTC and early in their career.

Q: What happens at the end of the new program?

A: The pilot is shifting to a year-long residency model for all teacher candidates.

Q: How is UTC supporting students in their decision making process about teaching as a career?

A: We are redesigning the curriculum to ensure students have more time in schools before they reach the year-long residency.
