## **UTC RN-BSN Program Curriculum Checklist**

Use this guide as a starting point only. Consult with an advisor in the School of Nursing to plan your curriculum. A grade of C or better must be earned for courses marked with an asterisk. Second baccalaureate degree students do not have to meet university general education requirements but must have a C or better in the non-nursing course requirements indicated with an asterisk.

Each student will be advised on what general education credits they need by the Gateway Advisor after receiving acceptance to UTC as an undergraduate transfer student, and having submitted transcripts for evaluation. Admission to the university, graduation from an accredited diploma or associate degree nursing program, a current RN license, currently practicing as RN, and a minimum GPA of 2.0 meets the requirements for admission to the RN-BSN concentration.
