


Q2 - Have you ever attended a training seminar or workshop offered by the Walker Center for Teaching and Learning (WCTL)?









Q5 - Please rank the methods of training you would most likely attend by clicking on the choices and dragging them into the appropriate order.





Q6 - What are the best times of day for you to participate in training? (mark all that apply)





Q7 - What are the best days of the week for you to participate in training? (mark all that apply)





Q13 - Have you received information and/or training about accessibility of course materials?



Q19 - What modalities of courses do you instruct? (as described in the course schedule; mark all that apply)





Q21 - Are you new to teaching online this semester?



I teach at another university in the afternoons. They have a bi-weekly luncheon where different faculty members present what they are doing in the classroom, technologies and modes of learning that they are utilizing, and just sharing different teaching techniques. I find it especially helpful to have this chance to learn from other faculty and see how different techniques could be transferred to different fields of teaching.

Is the Walker Center's mission these days really focused on improving student learning? The library staff and their sessions (Bo, for example, and the sessions on video production) are perhaps more helpful and more focused on teaching and learning.
