MARGARET FERGER SCHOLARSHIP FOR FUTURE TEACHERS

About the Scholarship Fund

The Margaret Ferger Scholarship honors a life-long and dedicated teacher in the Chattanooga Public Schools. Due to her generosity, the Chattanooga Hamilton County Retired Teachers Association (CHCRTA) established this scholarship to acknowledge her passion for teaching and to encourage high school students to pursue a career as a classroom teacher. In 2019, the scholarship is a one-time award in the amount of \$1,500 to a maximum of three recipients. The award will be sent to the college upon verification of college enrollment. The criteria, rubric, and other details are provided annually to HCDE School Counselors and HCDE College Advisors.

Scholarship Criteria

- Applications are accepted from any high school senior graduating, in good standing, in the Class of 2019 from a public school in Hamilton County. The applicant must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.50, with equal consideration to all applicants meeting the GPA requirement.
- Applicants must demonstrate a desire to enter the teaching profession, preferably in Hamilton County.
- Applicants must be accepted by and attend a regionally accredited, non-proprietary, community or four year college in the fall following his/her high school graduation.

In order to be considered for this scholarship, applicants must submit the application

along with the following information.

- An official high school transcript which includes cumulative GPA and ACT/SAT score(s).
- A typed two page essay (Essay details below.)
- One to two page resume, using a bullet point format. Include educational background, extra-curricular activities, work experience, community involvement, awards, accomplishments, etc. Examples of a 'bullet point resume format' are available on the Internet.
- One letter of recommendation from a classroom teacher, principal or school counselor who knows the applicant's academic ability, work ethic and character. The letter must be typed on the school's letterhead paper.

Student Essay

Essay Title: Why I Desire To Become A Teacher.

The reasons to become a teacher are endless! Perhaps it is a career compatible with one's personal skills, interests and strengths. It may be the satisfaction of having a rewarding job, the chance to become a lifelong learner or because the applicant was encouraged or inspired by a teacher, parent or friend. Other reasons include historical events or issues and the opportunity to influence the future.

- Essay format: Double spaced, Times New Roman 11 or 12 point font, one-inch top, bottom, and side margins.
- Length: Approximately 500+ words, with a maximum length of two page typed essay.
- Compliance: No identifying information on the essay such as the name of the student's school, student's name, etc.
- Scoring Guide: Refer to the CHCRTA Scholarship Essay Rubric.

Mailing Instructions

- The scholarship application and supporting documents including the essay must arrive in one packet.
- Do not place the application in a special folder or staple documents together; use paper clips to keep materials in order.
- It is best to use an envelope that will hold the application without folding it, but not required.
- To be considered for the Margaret Ferger Scholarship, mail the application in its entirety and submit it to the following address. The packet must be <u>received</u> by Thursday, April 5, 2019 at 5:00 pm. Emailed, faxed, late and/or incomplete applications will <u>not</u> be considered.

Selection and Presentation

- Recipients are selected by members of the CHCRTA Scholarship Committee; the decisions of the judges are final.
- If possible, each school with a scholarship recipient will be notified in time for the presentation of the scholarship on its Awards Day.
- A certificate will be presented on Awards Day or another designated time set by the high school faculty. If preferred, a representative from CHCRTA will gladly present the scholarship. The award will be sent to the college upon verification of college enrollment.
- Each recipient of the scholarship and his or her parents or guardians will be invited to attend the CHCRTA meeting in August where he or she will be presented to the CHCRTA members.

Scholarship Myths

The value of the Margaret Ferger Scholarship Award is \$1,500. If a scholarship recipient spends five hours completing the application, that is equivalent to earning \$400 per hour. To look at it another way, if the applicant has a job making minimum wage @ \$7.25, how many hours will it take to earn \$1,500.00*
