PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Master's of Science in Nursing degree, Nurse Anesthesia Concentration is a 27-month program that requires full-time study. Upon completion of all didactic and clinical requirements with a specialization in nurse anesthesia, the graduate will be eligible to take the National Certification Examination offered by the Council on Certification of Nurse Anesthetists.

> The curriculum is comprised of core courses that cover research and theoretical considerations of advanced nursing practice, and professional and economic issues associated with today's healthcare environment. The specialty specific courses address the basic and advanced principles and practices of anesthesia with heavy emphasis on physiology, pathophysiology, and pharmacology.

The clinical anesthesia practicum courses begin in the first fall semester and continue throughout duration of the program. Students begin to administer anesthesia under constant supervision of clinical CRNA and/or anesthesiologist preceptors.

Our curriculum is demanding and rigorous. The time commitment required of successful students is substantial.

ADMISSIONS

Although each applicant is considered on an individual basis, the following are requirements for the Nurse Anesthesia concentration:

- A baccalaureate degree with a major in nursing from a National League for Nursing or Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education accredited program.
- Cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale in all undergraduate nursing courses.
- Currently held unencumbered TN RN licensure as a registered nurse in Tennessee or eligibility for Tennessee licensure.
- Students must have BLS, ACLS, and PALS certifications prior to enrollment. CCRN is strongly preferred.
- At least two years of critical care nursing experience is required for admission to the nurse anesthesia concentration.
- Credible and current (no more than five years old) scores from either the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) or the Miller Analogies Test (MAT)
- Official transcripts from all previous educational institutions are required.
- Three references required from the following who can attest to the applicant's clinical knowledge, skill, and potential aptitude for graduate study (e.g. colleague, supervisor, MD or nursing instructor)
- Resume and personal statement is required.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Full Accreditation: The Nurse Anesthesia Concentration is fully accredited by the Council on Accreditation of Nurse Anesthesia Education Programs (COA).
- **Tuition Benefits:** UTC offers some of the lowest tuition rates in the region. In addition UTC participates with fifteen other states in the Academic Common Market.
- **High Pass Rates:** UTC Nurse Anesthesia students traditionally score above the national average on their certification examination after graduation.
- No Competition: Nurse anesthesia students at UTC never have to compete with residents for the opportunities to participate in challenging clinical experiences.
