- The 2017-2018 academic year will mark **Dr. Jill Beard's** 10th year of service at UTC and her promotion to Senior Lecturer in the English department.
- **Dr. Lisa Godfrey**, Teacher in Catoosa County Public Schools and Dept. Chair for Piedmont International University, was selected to serve as a commissioner for the Commission on Collegiate Interpreter Education and to serve as the National Coordinator for the National American Sign Language Honor Society.
- In 2017, **Dr. John Harbison**, Learning and Development Master Facilitator and Leadership Coach at Cigna, facilitated a program to further develop individuals identified as high potential leaders within their organization. Classes were held in the U.S. as well as Madrid, Dubai, Mumbai, and Glasgow.
