



Violence that is an expression of the unequal power relationship between genders. At the Center for Women and Gender Equity, we believe that, while these crimes are overwhelmingly committed by men, the overriding similarities in these crimes are not the gender of the perpetrator or the victim but the desire to assert power and control over another person. Often this assertion of power and control manifests in minimizing the victim regardless of the gender identity or sex of the victim. Because we devalue the feminine within our culture, this "violence against the feminine" is often about either demonstrating the weakness and helplessness of the victim or the strength and superiority of the perpetrator.

LIMITED CONFIDENTIALITY Staff members acting as advocates for Survivor Advocacy Services have limited confidentiality. They are required to report only general information about the incidents of gender-based violence such as the nature, date, time and general location of the incident and they will take care to avoid reporting personally identifiable information about a survivor. Advocates will consult with the survivor regarding what information needs to be withheld to protect their identity. RESPECT, EMPATHY AND SUPPORT We acknowledge that you are the expert in your life. Therefore, we want to ensure survivor agency in decision-making. Advocates have knowledge and experience to assist you in making informed choices, but those choices are yours and deserve to be respected. SURVIVOR-CENTERED APPROACH Advocates are there to listen, not pass judgment or investigate. Advocates prioritize the rights, needs and wishes of the survivor.
