Application

Eligibility

In order to be considered for the UTC Orientation Leader (OL) position, each candidate must:

- Be a full-time undergraduate student at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga (UTC) throughout Spring 2021 and Fall 2021 semester
- Meet the GPA requirement:
 - o 0-59 hours: 3.0 cumulative GPA
 - o 60+ hours: 2.5 cumulative GPA
 - Hours and GPA will be verified during the application process and reviewed at the end of the Spring 2021 semester
- Be in good academic standing and have a conduct record in good standing. Both are required throughout the duration of the position from application through the first week of classes during the Fall 2021 semester.
- Be able to work effectively with a diverse group of team members and students.
- Be available to attend all training dates in April and May.
