Belmont University College of Pharmacy Participates in the Early Decision application through PharmCAS. The deadline is September 3. In addition to completing the PharmCAS application, you must arrange for PharmCAS to receive all of your official transcripts and fees by the deadline of the early admission cycle. The Early Decision program is a binding option for applicants who have decided that a particular pharmacy degree program is their first choice. An applicant may only apply for Early Decision at one institution. If an applicant is offered admission to the institution, he or she is obligated to accept the offer and will not be permitted to apply to any other PharmCAS institutions. If not accepted for Early Decision, applicant may then apply to other programs. Refer to the <u>PharmCAS application fee</u> <u>schedule</u> to determine the cost to apply to each additional program if admission was not granted via early decision.
