### Early Decision through PTCAS

Beginning with the 2020-2021 admissions cycle, early decision will no longer be offered as an option for PTCAS applicants and programs. PTCAS early decision has been a binding option in which applicants who are accepted by a DPT education program participating in early decision are not permitted to apply to any additional programs during the same admissions cycle unless released by the program.

## Application Breakdown

### **Application-Step 1- Gather your Materials and Determine your Eligibility**

AP and Online Courses	GRE
Virtual, online, AP and CLEP courses are accepted for Math, Statistics, and Psychology ONLY. Acceptable science courses are ones typically required for science majors.	Applicants may take the GRE multiple times, but applicants are considered incomplete and will NOT be reviewed until an official GRE score is reported through the program's PTCAS GRE code- 7744. DO NOT use University of Tennessee Health Science Center GRE code

### **Application-Step 2 and 3- Fill out and Submit Applications**

Application	Cost	Application Deadline	Letters of Recommendation
New PTCAS Application required every year	PTCAS Application fee \$155 plus \$60 for each additional school	ALL application materials, including transcripts, GRE scores, PT observation hours, and recommendation letters, must be <b>verified</b> by PTCAS within 4 weeks of the application close date for the Admissions Committee to consider the application.	Two letters of reference: a physical therapist with whom the applicant has worked or volunteered, and from either a basic science professor OR the applicant's academic advisor. ### **Application-Step 4 and 5- Interview and Decision**

Interview	Decisions	In-State v. Out-of-State
Mandatory interview for admission. Interviews are typically conducted on the following dates: November 22, November 23, December 13 or December 14	Rolling admission is conducted, applications are reviewed and seats are offered on a continuous basis until the entire class is full. Early decision will no longer be practiced after the 2019 application cycle.	Preference is given to residents of the State of Tennessee. However, this does not imply that Tennessee residents receive automatic acceptance. Out-of-state residents must pay the out-of-state student tuition rate except for students who reside within 50 miles of the city of Memphis who receive a 75 percent discount off the out-of-state tuition differential.
