GRE*

The admissions committee will base decisions upon several components of an application package. They include: overall and math/science grade point averages (GPAs), the personal interview, personal and professional references. *Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores* **are NOT** required for application.

* A majority of OT programs require the GRE for admission consideration. While LMU does not require the GRE applicants may opt to take it if applying to other programs. It is best to take the GRE in the winter of the third year

Candidacy Status

The LMU OTD Program will submit for Candidacy Status on April 15, 2020 by the Accreditation Council of Occupational Therapy Education (ACOTE), which is required to admit students.
