How to get the most out of your Language tutor sessions!

- 1. **Try some homework first.** Be sure you have read your class notes and attempted some homework before coming to tutoring.
- 2. **Come prepared.** Be sure you bring all course materials when you come for help. This includes all class notes, assignment and your textbook.
- 3. Come with SPECIFIC questions or topics in mind so you will have better results.
- 4. Come in more than 48 hours before your exam so you will not have to wait for help.
- 5. **Come on a regular basis.** A tutor cannot cover everything your professor covered the last 4 weeks of class in such a short time.
- 6. **Sit in the lab** One thing you can do is to come in the lab during the tutor time so that you can ask questions as they come up. Your tutor will not do your homework for you but will be there to clarify or help you understand the grammar or vocabulary presented.

Don't forget to attend class regularly. This free service is an adjunct to your language course and is not a replacement of materials presented by your instructors.
