Welcome to Dr. Oberheim

Dr. S. Tyler Oberheim graduated from Florida Gulf Coast University with a Master of Arts degree in Clinical Mental Health Counseling and then furthered his training in the counseling profession by obtaining his Doctor of Philosophy degree in Counseling and Counselor Education from the University of Florida. He has spent the last 10 years of his counseling career working with adults in residential treatment settings (specific focus on addictions [chemical and behavioral], psychiatric disorders, Autism and other mental health concerns) and adolescents aged 11 to 18 in a school setting. He is trained in Eye Movement Desensitization Reprocessing (EMDR), a Licensed Professional Counselor with Mental Health Services Provider designation in TN and a Licensed Mental Health Counselor in FL.

Through these counseling experiences he has gained experience with a multitude of presenting concerns, including but not limited to: chemical addictions, behavioral addictions (pornography, sex, shopping, gambling, eating disorders, video games, etc.), issues related to affectional and gender identity, members of the LGBTQIA+ community - with a specific focus on the transgender community, Autism Spectrum Disorder, sexuality and sex-positive therapy, anxiety, depression and trauma to name a few. His research interests include studying addictions within affectional and gender minority individuals, psychedelic assisted therapy, instrument development and adaptation, quantitative research methodology in the counseling literature and multicultural/social justice issues in counseling.



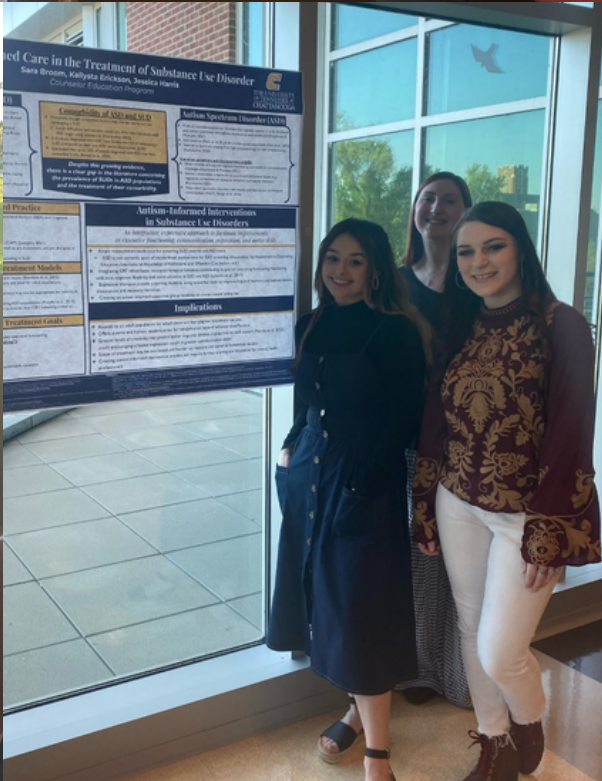
Farewell to Dr. Webster
