


## Capturing Direct Links to Articles: EBSCOhost Databases


EBSCO is one of the many vendors that provides access to full-text article content via online databases subscribed to by the UTC Library. The library subscribes to the following [EBSCOhost database](#). Follow these directions to capture direct links to articles from EBSCOhost databases.

1. Search for an article within an [EBSCOhost database](#).

2. Articles with available full-text online content will include a link to either "PDF" or "HTML" Full Text. This link will follow the article summary on the result page. Click on the link to make sure full text is available.

3. The full text will open within the browser window. To capture the “Persistent Link,” click on the link icon from the right tools menu.



4. The “Permalink” will appear above the article within your browser. Copy this link and paste it into any Blackboard course, e-mail, or other document. The URL can be used by both on- and off-campus users. Off-campus users will be prompted to enter their UTC ID/PW before being allowed access to the content.
