<sup>1</sup> Beginning in Fall 2010, race and ethnicity became self-reported categories in the application process. Race and Hispanic ethnicity are considered separate categories by the federal government and are reported as follows: All persons who identify themselves as Hispanic are reported only in the Hispanic category. Individuals who are not Hispanic and report more than one racial background are reported in the multi-racial, non-Hispanic category. All other individuals who do not claim Hispanic origin, nor multiple races, are classified in the single racial category chosen.
