²The U.S. lifted most sanctions on Iraq on May 23, 2003. As of July 30, 2004, exports or reexports to Iraq must be licensed or otherwise authorized by the Department of Commerce. All OFAC licenses, issued prior to July 30, 2004, for the exportation or reexportation of goods, software or technology to Iraq remain valid until the expiration date stated in the license, or if no expiration date is provided in the license, until July 30, 2005. Sanctions remain on assets previously blocked by U.S. sanctions. Prohibitions remain on engaging in transactions with certain Iraqi cultural property and with certain high-ranking representatives of the former regime and their agents. The General Prohibitions under the Commerce Department regulations remain in effect.

³ Defense exports to the Government of Rwanda are reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

⁴ Zaire (The Democratic Republic of the Congo) is eligible for limited defense exports on a case-by-case basis.

⁵ Afghanistan is eligible for limited defense exports on a case-by-case basis.
