

Admittance Requirements for Voice Students:

MUS 0550: Purpose: Available for **non-majors** and students who simply want to improve by taking applied lessons. Repertoire negotiable with professor.

MUS 1550: Purpose: Available for **BA or non-voice majors**. Students may take if they wish to improve their skills to enter the MUS 2550 level in order to be a voice major or minor. Audition requirement: Sing 2 prepared pieces, preferably one in Italian. Must demonstrate at least elementary sight-reading ability.

MUS 2550: Purpose: Required for 4 semesters in the **Music Education, Music Therapy, and Composition** degrees, but may be taken by BA vocal majors or performance minors. Audition requirements: Must be able to read music and prepare songs without rudimentary assistance from the instructor. Must demonstrate at least elementary sight-reading ability. Should audition with at least 2-3 memorized art songs, one preferably in Italian.

MUSP 2550: Purpose: Required for 4 semesters in the **Vocal Performance** major, particularly for those who wish to pursue a professional classical singing career. Audition requirements: Must be able to read music and prepare songs without rudimentary assistance from the instructor. Must demonstrate good sight-reading ability. Should audition with at least 2-3 memorized art songs, one preferably in Italian.

MUS 3550: Purpose: Required for 3 semesters of the **Music Education** major and 4 semesters of the **Composition** major. This may also be taken for upper level study by BA vocal majors or performance minors. These auditions will take place during Semester End Juries prior to the junior year. Audition requirements: Demonstrate intermediate sight-reading skills. Should audition with at least 4 memorized songs, including Italian, French, and German.

MUSP 4550: Purpose: Required for **Vocal Performance** majors for their last 4 semesters. They should audition for the Music **Division Jury** the semester prior to the junior year. Audition requirements: Should audition with 5-6 memorized songs to include Italian, French, and German. Students will be required to submit a list of vocal literature covered during the first 2 years of vocal study, which should include at least 20 to 25 songs or arias from the classical repertoire. The voice should be of exceptional quality and have promise for a career in classical vocal performance, and/or admittance into a graduate school program.

Applied Voice Literature Requirements for End of Semester and Division Juries

MUS 0550: No jury required. Literature assigned depending on student goals.

MUS 1550: The ability to sing at least 3 songs by memory. Repertoire should be determined by the teacher and by the goals of the particular student. Should be able to demonstrate reasonable progress in basic vocal technique. **Jury required for voice majors.**

MUS 2550: Freshman level: The ability to sing a minimum of 4-5 songs by memory each semester. Repertoire should cover the early Italian and English/American repertoire. Should demonstrate progress in vocal technique. Sophomore level: The ability to sing a minimum of 5-6 songs by memory each semester. Repertoire should cover Italian, English/American, with the addition of a second and third foreign language (French and German) in successive semesters. Should demonstrate progress in vocal technique commensurate with advancement to upper division. **Jury required each semester.**

MUSP 2550 (Vocal Performance): Freshman level: The ability to sing a minimum of 5-6 songs by memory each semester. Repertoire should cover the early Italian and English/American repertoire. Other languages added at the discretion of the professor. Progress made in vocal technique and musicianship. Sophomore level: The ability to sing a minimum of 6-7 songs by memory each semester. French and German repertoire should be added. Progress made in vocal technique and musicianship commensurate with advancement to upper division. **Jury required each semester.**

MUS 3550 (Music Education and Composition): Junior level: The ability to sing a minimum of 6-7 songs by memory each semester. Repertoire should include Italian, English-American, French, and German. Improved vocal technique and musicianship should be demonstrated. Senior level: 7-8 songs by memory each semester. Continued improvement in technique, diction, and musicianship. For the **Music Education** and **Composition** majors, students must present a **Senior Recital** at least 30 minutes in length, and must pass a Division Jury at least 3 weeks prior to the recital.

MUSP 4550 (Vocal Performance): Junior level: The ability to sing a minimum of 7-8 songs by memory each semester. Repertoire should cover Italian, English-American, French, and German. Improvement in technique, diction, and musicianship. Student will present a **Junior Recital**, about 30 minutes in length, after passing a Division Jury at least 3 weeks before the recital. Senior level: Sing a minimum of 8-9 songs in Italian, English-American, French, and German. Repertoire should include either an operatic or an oratorio aria. Inclusion of repertoire that includes additional instrumental collaboration is desirable. Student should demonstrate readiness for graduate study or its equivalent. Students will present a **Senior Recital**, about 45 minutes in length, after passing a Division Jury at least 3 weeks prior to the recital.
