Program Details

Overview: This proposal is for a customized program based in Havana, Cuba. The proposal lists included program support services and an itinerary customized with academic and cultural activities to support your program goals.

Cuba Requirements: API will be offering this program in accordance with OFAC Regulations, code 515.565. The students must be enrolled in a course for credit or involved in a structured educational program.

What's Included:

Pre-Departure Services

- Austin-based API Program Manager assigned to your program to coordinate the program development and pre-departure process
- Student and faculty pre-departure orientation materials including logistical and cultural information
- Online forms collection including medical information, emergency contacts, and flight details

Airfare

- Round-trip airfare on one group flight for Chattanooga or Atlanta-Havana-Chattanooga or Atlanta will be organized by API.
- API will request group flight quotes for both Chattanooga and Atlanta departures and provide options and costs to UT Chattanooga.
- Airfare is not included in the student program fees quoted above and will be added onto the program fee at the time of billing.

On-Site Academic and Logistical Support

- API on-site Resident Director to book, implement and oversee program activities and excursions and serve as an emergency contact available 24/7

- One of the most significant benefits of partnering with API is the availability of our highly trained on-site directors who specialize in minimizing risk through careful pre-departure planning and preparation. Every API Resident Director is thoroughly trained in emergency response and receives ongoing training and support. Once abroad, on the ground support is available to students and faculty. API Resident Directors are available 24/7 in the event of an emergency and are ready to enact emergency action plans when necessary.
- One group airport pick-up in Havana and one group airport return in Havana
- API cultural, health, and safety orientation upon arrival, with materials provided, including: On-Site Orientation Handbook (including an itinerary and map), emergency phone card, emergency contact card and instructions
- Group welcome meal and group farewell meal
- Bilingual Cuban guide/translator for all guided tours, guest lectures, and cultural and academic visits
- API Program Leader, required in accordance with OFAC regulations, to accompany your group on all API arranged activities, facilitate program logistics, and serve as the faculty leader's point of contact on the ground
- Cuban medical insurance
- Cuban entry visa
- Academic visits and cultural activities, as listed in the itinerary (gratuities included)
- Overnight excursion for 2 days/1 night to Las Terrazas and Vinales, including all meals, accommodations, and transportation costs
- Student residencia housing in shared rooms
 - Within a beautifully restored home located in the Vedado neighborhood; rooms are offered only to University of Tennessee Chattanooga students and overseen by local host/host family
 - Double or triple occupancy rooms
 - Laundry service once a week
 - Daily breakfast and dinner included (breakfast and lunch only on Saturdays and Sundays). Meals are taken in the residencia dining room, which may also be used for group discussion and debriefings.

If more than 15 students are enrolled, housing will be divided into two or more residencias (maximum occupancy of 16 students per residencia)

Please note that Wi-Fi is not available at most private residencias as Cuba does not yet have the infrastructure to support access in homes. Internet cards can be purchased on-site for access to the public Wi-Fi network at various Wi-Fi hotspots in the neighborhood.

- Ground transportation via private bus on all API-arranged activities
- Post-program evaluation summary provided to university

Faculty Provisions (for each faculty leader)

- API group airport reception/return
- Accommodation in a single room with private bathroom in Havana (usually in a separate house or apartment within short walking distance to student housing), unless otherwise requested
- Daily breakfast and dinner included (breakfast and lunch only on Saturdays and Sundays)
- Cuban entry visa
- Cuban medical insurance

- Group meals
- All API-arranged academic visits, cultural activities, and excursions with students (including entrance fees, transportation, and single hotel room on overnight excursions)

Not Included:

- Any additional meals or activities not specified or listed as "not included"
- Faculty salary
- Classroom space
- Personal expenses (e.g. passport fees, luggage fees, souvenirs, etc.)

Proposed itinerary follows. Program fee subject to change with any revisions made to the initial request. Fees and program services are guaranteed if a contract is signed and returned by 3 months from proposal sent date.

Proposed Itinerary

This itinerary is not authorized by our Cuban partner until the contract is signed and the program participation numbers are finalized. As such, the itinerary is subject to modifications based on availability and/or governmental approvals.

Tour of Las Terrazas community and visit the ruins of a French Coffee Plantation built in 1801

Optional swimming at Baños de San Juan or partake in optional ziplining (35 cuc fee for ziplining at student's own cost)

Depart for Viñales Valley, a UNESCO World Heritage site known for its mogotes, or spectacular dome-like limestones outcrops that rise as high as 900 feet. Crops of fruit, vegetables, coffee, and tobacco are grown by traditional methods here.

Modifying the Proposal

Payment Schedule and Important Deadlines

Please note the following important deadlines regarding program confirmation, valid passport copies for Cuban entry visas, student forms, and university payments:

Program Confirmation Deadline: November 7, 2019	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The University will submit an initial roster of students to API. If the program does not have enough students to run, notify API in writing by this date for cancellation without penalty.• If the program will run, API will invoice a non-refundable confirmation payment for each student on the initial roster for which the University becomes liable on this date. This payment will be applied toward the program fee assessed per student based on final student numbers.• University will submit to API a color scan or copy of valid passport for all students and faculty.
Enrollment Deadline and Forms Deadline: December 6, 2019	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Last day to add/drop participants, including students, faculty or guests. Only participants who have submitted a valid passport copy to API by this date are eligible to receive a Cuban entry visa.• API will invoice the University the program balance for each student listed on the final roster, for which the University becomes liable on this date. No refunds will be issued for any withdrawals that occur after this date.• API will also invoice the University for a refundable security deposit.
Final Payment Deadline: January 7, 2020	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Full payment is due to API from the University.

PLEASE NOTE: API must receive all copies of valid passports at the Confirmation Deadline, so as to ensure that API can secure Cuban entry visas for program participants. We recommend advising students who do not yet have a passport or have an expiring passport to apply for first-time issue or renewal via the expedited process with the US Department of State (or corresponding foreign embassy for non-US citizens).

Frequently Asked Questions

Does API have a minimum number of students needed for a program to run?

The standard minimum to make a program economically feasible is 10 students. However, we are sometimes able to make exceptions. Running a program with fewer than 10 students may increase the per-student price.

Can faculty or students bring guests on the program (spouses, children)?

Students are not permitted to bring guests on the program. API does not encourage faculty to bring guests either, as we find that it can often disrupt the group dynamics. However, we do accommodate spouses and family members of the faculty leaders if the institutional partner permits faculty guests on customized programs. Guests will need to submit some standard forms to API. Minor children under the age of 13 are not permitted on customized programs in Cuba.

If the API application deadline has passed, can we still recruit students?

We are at times able to admit more students to a program after the application deadline has passed, but this depends on various factors such as housing availability and group flights. Before denying a student admittance into your program, please check with API to see if there is still room. We are always happy to welcome more participants if possible.

Can students use our institution's health insurance coverage on your programs?

US medical or travel insurance is not accepted in Cuba. The Cuban government requires that all travelers visiting from abroad purchase travel health insurance before entering the country. Typically, US airlines flying to Cuba include travel health insurance with the purchase of airfare. If API books the group flight for your program, then API will ensure that Cuban medical insurance is provided. If API does not book the group flight for your program, then the university is responsible for verifying with the airline on whether travel health insurance coverage is included with their airfare purchase.
