## WELCOME

In these uncertain times, UTC faculty and staff have remained committed to teaching & learning, outreach, creative endeavors, and scholarly inquiry. The 2020 - 2021 ORSP Annual Report documents UTC's sponsored activity achievements, which make invaluable contributions towards UTC's mission and strategic goals. The campus continues to attract external resources that invest in our community, engage research and scholarship across academic disciplines, promote student opportunities, foster innovation through research and development, and grow our capacities in strategic and sustainable ways.

In FY21, UTC faculty and staff prepared and submitted nearly 200 proposals, achieving a high-water mark in UTC'S proposal activity. Even when adjusting for outliers, FY21 proposals reflect a collective potential dollar value in excess of \$82 million - a 34% increase in funds requested over FY20. The good efforts of our faculty and staff were recognized with awards totaling \$13.6 million in funds for outreach, scholarship, and student support, with an additional \$43 million in HEERF funding in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

While these achievements reflect the meritorious efforts of our faculty, they also underscore the contributions of the many units that support research and sponsored program activity. Please join me in congratulating all of the FY21 awardees for their successes and thanking those who have submitted proposals during FY21. The skill, expertise, and commitment of so many on campus working together is an investment that will pay dividends for our shared future.



#### PROPOSALS & AWARDS WITH HEERF









#### FIVE-YEAR TREND - AWARDS







### CORE RESEARCH CENTERS\*

#### PROPOSALS AND AWARDS



\*The Research Centers are classified as Administrative departments through the Vice Chancellor of Research for ORSP reporting purposes.

The Center for Urban Informatics and Progress (CUIP), led by **Dr. Mina Sartipi**, is a hub for innovations in response to urban challenges. Dr. Sartipi engaged partners and experts on proposals with a potential value of \$22.3 million in FY2021 and has been awarded \$1.6 million for her work with energy-conscious traffic signal control systems for optimized fuel consumption.






SimCenter, led by **Dr. Tony Skjellum**, serves as a research accelerator for advanced modeling and simulation, and acts as UTC's core facility for High-Performance Computing. In FY2021, Dr. Skjellum led 7 different R&D projects and was awarded more than \$700k. Dr. Skjellum has also submitted proposals valued at \$3 million in FY2021.

**Dr. Zibin Guo (Social, Cultural, and Justice Studies)**, received an award of \$139,823 from the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs to support his Tai Chi Chuan (martial arts) training and outreach program for physically disabled veterans. Dr. Guo's work allows for veterans to transform their assistive device of a wheelchair to a tool of empowerment and artistic expression.






**Dr. Jin Wang (Mathematics)** received an award of \$200,000 from the NSF to support his research on Deterministic Models for Waterborne Infections. He was also awarded an additional \$122,000 fr from the NIH to study the impacts of the COVID-19 vaccination campaign on the transmission and spread of SARS-CoV-2 and on the economic growth in the US.



Dr. Brad Harris (Civil and Chemical Engineering) secured more than \$591k from the NSF to provide summer research experiences and curricular development activities for regional community college faculty in the field of cyber-physical systems. The project will contribute to new knowledge and technology, and help bridge the preparedness gap among community college transfer students.






**Dr. Mengjun Xie (Computer Science and Engineering)** brought more than \$1.2 million in funding in FY2021. Dr. Xie's endeavors aim to increase interest in Cyber Security among students to fill the much-needed gap of Cyber Defense Professionals in the U.S.


**Dr. Kristi Wick (School of Nursing)** has received an award of \$28k from the Community Foundation of Greater Chattanooga to support her COVID-19 vaccination campaign. Dr. Wick also submitted a proposal with the Tennessee Department of Health to the CDC, which is poised to bring in \$1.5 million to address disparities among high-risk populations of COVID-19 including racial and minority populations and rural communities.

**Laurie Allen (Art Based Collaborative)** has received an award of \$3,500 from the Alabama Department of Education to support Buckets and Brushes, a wholeschool arts integration program designed to increase access to music and visual art.


