TRAVEL ABROAD PROGRAM

Description: A&SRC Explorers is a curricular program open to members of the Arts and Sciences Residential College (A&SRC). This competitive program is sponsored by the College of Arts and Sciences, Center for Global Education, and Housing and Residence Life. Consideration for participation in this exclusive program requires the submission of this completed application and supporting materials by the November 1, 2025 deadline.

Selected students will enroll in the course *Encountering Global Cultures* (MLNG2000) for three (3) credit hours in the Spring 2026 semester. As part of the course curriculum, students will travel abroad during Spring Break week (from March 14-21). Our travel destination will be Mexico, with stays in the Yucatan peninsula, a region reflecting the country's rich history and cultural diversity. We will explore archaeological sites of a significant pre-Columbian civilization, consider the confluence of this culture with those of the European colonists that created the Mexican cultural identity, experience life in modern Mexico, and engage with students from the Universidad Autónoma de Yucatán (UADY). Upon returning to UTC, students will channel their experiences abroad into their final projects consisting of a public presentation with visual aids (e.g., PowerPoint slideshow, cultural artifacts, video/audio samples, etc.).

Eligibility: Full-time students meeting the following requirements may apply for this competitive opportunity:

- Enrolled in at least 12 credit hours, including MLNG2000 (3 credit hrs.) during the Spring 2026 semester.
- Active participants in one of the A&SRC's RLCs (i.e., Helping Hands, Life Out Loud, MEDIC, Mocs in STEM, Music Row, POLIS, Sustainable Mocs, or Writers' Collective).
- Must be in good academic standing (a minimum 2.75 GPA is required for consideration).
- Demonstrated engagement by attending at least six A&SRC, RLC, Center for Global Education, and other campus and community service events by the time of the application deadline.
- Eligible and prepared to secure a passport.

Program Cost: Students will contribute \$750.00 of the program cost. Additionally, they are responsible for obtaining a valid passport. The Center for Global Education, College of Arts and Sciences, and Division of Access and Engagement will subsidize the remaining cost.
