Application deadline: April 30, 2026

VEP Phase I

Concept Development and Self-Study | May 26-June 29, 2026

- Five-week online curriculum, guided by Rollins College of Business faculty and staff
- Build understanding of key business issues and prepare for Boot Camp
- Includes 12 months of free access to LivePlan business planning software

VEP Phase II

VEP Boot Camp | July 18-25, 2026

- Intensive eight-day residency in Chattanooga, Tennessee
- Hands-on workshops and networking with business experts
- Learn the "nuts and bolts" of launching and growing a business

VEP Phase III

Advising and Venture Development | August - December 2026

- Five months of continued advising and venture support
- Opportunities to apply for grant funding

Norma is the founder and CEO of LIFE3 Academy Charter School, an institution committed to cultivating lifelong learners. Since opening its doors in 2021, LIFE3 Academy has served over 500 students in grades K-6. In 2025, Norma expanded her vision by launching the Veterans Founders Academy for Public Charters.

In October 2023, Paul launched Nashville Adventures, a company offering customized walking tours that highlight the rich history, vibrant culture and legendary music scene of Nashville, Tennessee. The business reached profitability within its first year, and his business continues to grow to meet the needs of tourists and locals in the area.

VEP is open to veterans who:

- Have separated (or are separating) from active duty with an honorable discharge
- Have a business idea or an existing business less than three years old

Preference is given to veterans who are:

- Service-connected disabled (as designated by the VA), or
- Service-distinguished for exemplary military conduct

HOW TO APPLY

The VEP has a selective application process that reflects the unique opportunity and valuable resources being offered to eligible veterans. Successful candidates demonstrate a strong interest in entrepreneurship and venture creation, the motivation to own and operate a business, and a high likelihood of active participation and completion of the entire VEP curriculum.
